

The Hundred Parishes Society

Website www.hundredparishes.org.uk is a mine of information, with links to more detailed resources and suggestions for walks, as well as advance notice of events related to local heritage, conservation or culture.

Recently, members were treated to a fascinating talk by geologist Gerald Lucy. His presentation on the last hundred million years put into perspective the miniscule period of man's existence, around 250,000 years, and the even smaller time span for which there is recorded history. Today's coastal erosion is part of a continuing process that has seen gradual but dramatic realignments of the Earth's surface over the last 4 billion years. The changes over such a long period of time are difficult to comprehend. The continents as we know them were once one big land mass. Fossils in the Himalayas date from when that area was beneath the sea. British coal was formed long ago when the UK was somewhere near the Equator. Nearer home, and much more recently, the River Thames once flowed through Harlow and Chelmsford before joining the Rhine (there was no North Sea then). Our local flintstones were created in a thin layer of chalk by chemical reaction; and our so-called Hertfordshire puddingstones were dumped by a retreating glacier. Gerald gave us much to think about.

Our next talk will be in Stansted Mountfitchet at Crafton Green Community Centre on the evening of July 11, starting at 7:30pm and open to members and non-members. Our speaker, Tony Morton of Essex Wildlife Trust, will address another aspect of our heritage with a talk about woodland in and around the Hundred Parishes. Please come along – the £5 entry fee for non-members includes tea and biscuits.

This month's message from the Chairman of the Parish Council

Those who take a really keen interest in planning may have noticed that we have finally submitted our response to the CALA application at Ventnor Lodge. If you haven't seen it, I can tell you that we have objected to the application on the grounds, principally, of unsustainability.

We had tried, over several meetings to persuade CALA that those facilities which exist within the village are limited and overstretched. We had hoped that we would be able to elicit from them a commitment to renovate and repair the village hall, which would have gone a long way to securing its future use and thereby mitigating the effect, to some extent, of the additional people who would live in the village.

For their part, CALA insisted that any financial contribution to the village would have to be within the realm of a s106 Agreement and as such would limit their contribution to one which was appropriate and legally acceptable regarding a development of just twelve houses. Consequently, the only offer made to date, and that only verbally, was one of £10,000 to £15,000. Quite clearly this would not be enough to even begin work on underpinning the hall.

We have repeatedly tried to arrange further meetings with CALA but as time has passed they have become less and less approachable and increasingly reluctant to agree any action to assist our community.

Our own planning team, Lindy, Brandon and myself, but almost entirely Lindy, have put a considerable amount of work into this and I think it is a great shame that we have not been able to achieve the repairs that are sorely needed to the hall. Some work continues behind the scenes and I remain moderately hopeful that we can find a positive result. Either way, my thanks to Lindy who really has put in a tremendous amount of work.

I will of course keep you posted with progress and the result of UDC's Planning Committee hearing. Alan.

CRIME PREVENTION ADVICE (from Essex Police)

Your identity and personal information are valuable so it's important to protect them.

Criminals can use your personal details to open bank accounts and get credit cards, passports and driving licences in your name. This is known as identity crime.

Identity theft and identity fraud are two types of identity crime.

- Identity theft is when someone gains enough information about an identity (e.g, name, date of birth, address) to commit identity fraud. It's the misappropriation of the identity of another person without their knowledge or consent.
- Identity Fraud occurs when a stolen identity is used to gain goods or services by deception e.g, open a bank account, gain benefits or apply for credit cards.

So here's our advice

- Criminals commit identity theft by stealing personal information, usually from documents they find in the rubbish.
- A stolen identity can result in identity fraud which can affect your personal finances and chances of getting a loan, credit card or mortgage.
- If any of your cards are lost or stolen, cancel them straight away and never give card details or personal information over the phone or on the internet when other people can see or hear.
- Don't carry cards unnecessarily. If you don't need them, leave them in a safe place.

- If your driving licence is lost or stolen, contact the issuing organisation straight away.
- Get in the habit of checking your bank statements. If you spot any transactions you didn't expect, contact the company concerned.
- Destroy unwanted documents using a shredder. Don't throw away bills, bank statements, receipts or unwanted post in your name without shredding it first.
- Keep personal information somewhere safe like a lockable drawer or cupboard.
- And when it comes to Passwords and PINs:
 - Keep passwords safe and don't store them anywhere that means they may be stolen such as your purse or on your mobile phone.
 - Try not to use the same password for more than one account.
 - Never give personal or account details to anyone
 who contacts you unexpectedly even if they claim
 to be from your bank or the police. Take a phone
 number and call them back using another line to
 make sure they are genuine. Remember a bank will
 never ask for your PIN or your whole password.

CRIME PREVENTION ADVICE (from Action Fraud) Counterfeit Cheques

Businesses are being contacted for the sale of goods or services by fraudsters, who request to pay by cheque. The fraudster sends a cheque with a higher value than the amount expected, and then sends the business a request for the difference with instructions on how it should be paid back. This is usually by bank transfer or through a money transfer service, such as Western Union or PaySafe. Once the 'refund' has been provided, it is realised that the cheque provided was fraudulent and no funds are credited to the business's account.

Criminals are targeting a wide range of services including paintings or other artwork, photography and lessons, with various amounts requested to be refunded. The average amount requested to be refunded is £1,818. The highest amount requested was over £80,000.

• Be cautious of payments where the amount provided is higher than expected. Refuse to provide the service

- unless the correct balance is received or wait until the cheque has cleared before refunding the difference.
- Always contact banks on a trusted number found on their website or correspondence that is known to be authentic to confirm whether the cheque has cleared.
- Do not feel pressured to provide a refund before the cheque has cleared.

Report from District Councillors Neil Hargreaves and Joanna Parry

At the time of writing the consultation period is closed for the Cala Homes Ventnor Lodge application for 12 houses and we await the officer's recommendation, after which it will go to the Planning Committee. Note however that anyone can still email UDC planning about it and have comments loaded to the website even though you can't submit online. It has been a subject of annoyance on other applications that developers routinely carry on submitting documents and responses after the close date and have them published, with apparently no right of comment from anyone else. Developers never use the online system, they just email the officer, and we can all do the same at any time.

Jo Parry says the issues with the Local Plan development remain largely as reported last month. A slightly better project plan document has been issued, but only at the very last moment before the June Working Group meeting. From the brief glance I have had, it still is inadequate as the key control document for such a major and vital project. For example it uses colour coding and symbols but has no key for them. Despite this being raised by R4U councillors at the meeting, no explanation was given. This lack of quality control is something we have had to deal with on UDC recommendations for planning applications, where it seems as though there is no self checking or review of documents before issue. Patently bad material is published, and in the past typically accepted by the Planning Committee. Our R4U members of the committee challenge these matters and have had some success, but it would be so much better and efficient it were correct in the first place, and this is one of the issues Jo and I will be raising with the chief executive

Connecting the Plan development with the Cala Homes application is the matter of contributions to local infrastructure. The pattern is that developers have grand presentations where they are desperately keen to improve your particular nice bit of the world and make vague offers of assistance. But the moment they smell victory on the application (pretty much every developer application which is not totally bonkers is approved in the end) they become unavailable when parish councils want to discuss financial contributions and they get away with making only the most basic contributions for education as instructed by Essex. Unless there is something very specific to the application like a road or a new main sewer pipe, applications of this size are usually allowed by UDC to get off free. But it does not have to be like this. UDC could have implemented Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). This charges builders a levy per square metre on every building. UDC hired a French merchant bank to calculate how much this should be. It has the advantage of also being charged on every property, even commercial – at present individual and small developments get off entirely free, despite making the same per house demands on local services as any other house. And the big gain for parish councils is that 20% automatically goes to the parish for spending at their discretion. They therefore do not need to go cap in hand to developers. UDC however dropped CIL, without a really convincing reason, seemingly putting it in the 'too much work' category. At the Plan Working Group this is being raised every time, but is still being ignored.

On a lighter note, what is wrong with the street names Church End, Birds End, Greys Hollow, Rickling Green, Hallfield, Woodside, Coney Acre, Brick Kiln Lane and Ricking Green Road?

The answer is that they were about to be banned, if presented as new names, under UDC's new road naming policy. This was passed by the Cabinet despite an R4U councillor asking them not to. The policy would have banned several words including 'The', punctuation marks, words of more than three syllables, names of more than two words, and several popular endings such as View and Way and End. It also listed 19 topographical endings which officers were interpreting as compulsory, and helpfully explained for example what a Crescent is, and that a Square is a square. Parish and town councils were not consulted.

Fortunately there is a call-in process and I was able to get the required three members of the Scrutiny Committee to request a review the decision, the Scrutiny committee was convened specially, and it is now going back to Cabinet. I have suggested how the policy can be improved (largely by copying Cambridge's excellent document) and also strengthened to add a power to refuse any name considered unsuitable. Just in case there is something no-one ever thought of while writing the policy!


