### From the Vicarage Study Rev. Peter Allen, Priest-in-Charge of Newport with Widdington, Quendon and Rickling.

I wonder how many everyday sayings and pithy statements we all recognise find their origin within the Bible? The following are just a small selection with the chapter and verse references if you wish to look them up.

Another often heard saying is 'the sun shines on the righteous'.

This may be true but this quote is incomplete.

The full quote from Matthew 5:43-45 is:



'You have heard that it was said, "You shall love your neighbour and hate your enemy." But I (Jesus) say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be children of your Father in

heaven; for he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous.

Knowing the verse in its entirety paints a different and more complete picture of God telling us that God is the source of all good things, and he shares them liberally to all whether deserved or not. Our misuse of the quotation may be innocent enough, but I use it to illustrate that a little knowledge can be a misleading thing when it comes to Bible knowledge or knowledge of God.

One way to rectify this is to look deeper into the Bible and find out for ourselves what it actually says rather than what we think it says. Having said that, such deeper digging will inevitably throw up questions as well as answers, but I would say this is far preferable to just accepting 'popular wisdom' about what it contains. Despite our questions about the Bible, of which I still have many, it will better inform our view of God, his purposes, his views about us, and just how Jesus fits into the whole picture.

#### From the Parish Council Chair

Dear Villagers,

That's enough of the rain thank you! Summer - all is forgiven!

Maybe we'll have beautiful weather to suit our Autumn Daze celebration of all things mellow and fruitful? Save the date for a bouncy castle, apple-pressing, pumpkin competition, food stalls, local business stalls and more on The Green in the afternoon of Saturday 30th September, and look out for further details around the village.

The planned Boundary Walk around the edges of the parish is going ahead in the first week of September. Sorry we cannot be precise about the date yet but that is dependent on the harvest and weather. We have a route planned that sticks as close to the parish boundary as we can manage. With help from Maces Farms we have one-off permission to walk in areas that are normally private and off-limits to the public; following a preparatory recce I can confirm that even for those who know the area

well it's great to be able to get to new territory and see new views. The full walk will be something in the region of 15km and some of it will be rough walking; there will be opportunities to join the walk for part of the route if the whole route is daunting! More on this elsewhere in this issue.

Related to the Walk, we still have a few spaces free on our First Aid training course, run by the British Red Cross, and scheduled for Thursday 17th August. Please drop me a line if you'd like to attend.

We are getting busier with the Neighbourhood Plan. Focus is currently on sites to be recommended for development within Newport, Quendon and Rickling; any such sites will be put to the community for consultation, of course, before inclusion in the refreshed NhP, as it's the residents' plan! That consultation with the village is likely to happen in the New Year.

The Call for Sites announcement from UDC regarding preferred development sites is on schedule to be made public in October as a first draft; this important publication will need to tally up with what is specified in the refreshed NhP. Phil and Brandon, with Sue Joannou, continue to work hard on this topic, and would welcome input from residents.

We are still looking for recruits for the Council. If you'd like to help run the village, and get involved with improving life in the village (and potentially defend it from large-scale development!), then please drop Keith our Clerk a line (quendonandrickling.clerk@hotmail.com), or contact any councillor.

It's a short one this month; no PC meeting in August but, refreshed, we'll be back to the detail in September. Best wishes for a pleasant August and a relaxing high summer all round. Better get whispering to those Pumpkins to prime them for their moment of glory in Autumn Daze!

#### **District Councillors' Report**

#### **Local Plan**

At a recent workshop members were given a presentation by a chartered surveyor on the balance of housing sites which is needed to get a Local Plan approved. The Plan is 2021 to 2041 and with what is currently permitted, plus an allowance for windfall sites not included in the Plan, typically small ones, we 'only' need to find 4,735 houses more, up to 2041.

On top of this must be a buffer, which is needed as developers challenge the figures for the 5-year land supply requirement, in order to trigger the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) 'tilted balance' towards development. So, if you have some spare

in the figures, it is easier to withstand challenges on deliverability of sites, or indeed have the ability to refuse a poor application on a Plan site, without the risk of losing the 5-year supply.

Questions have been raised at the July full council meeting about water supplies, and sewerage treatment. A new Water Cycle Study is in progress. But the previous ones have not been convincing, and with the aquifers which supply most of our water already over abstracted, our streams and rivers routinely dry every summer, I cannot see how any report can get round the obvious conclusion for more house building. The reason the waterfall at Audley End runs all year and there is water in front of the house is because Affinity Water abstract aquifer water at their works just north of Newport to re-fill the river... made dry by too much abstraction.

We are told the regulation 18 site allocations will be published in the Autumn. Meanwhile the government has not yet enacted the much-mentioned dropping of the 300,000 house a year target, which is part of determining our housing target. A revised NPPF, which is the overarching planning guidance, is also about to be published which will be the third revision of this document, first published in 2012.

#### **Finances**

I recently presented to Cabinet the outturn for the year to March 2023. The General Fund had a net underspend against budget of £342k, which will be added to the main budget reserve to take that to just short of £7m. The council's overall reserves went up from £23.8m to £25.2m. We have to make significant budget cuts for future years, under the umbrella of Blueprint Uttlesford, which is considering all revenues, costs and services. The £7m is the reserve not allocated to anything and which will be needed to provide a cushion while the changes are enacted.

The council housing budget has been under stress as a result of a combination of factors, including needing interim contract staff, a full condition inspection of every property at a cost of £500k including the extra staff to coordinate this and further actions, and inflation not covered by rent rises. The intention was to run a £3.3m surplus, to be partly reinvested in new houses, but it was reduced to £1.3m, which is not enough for this and needs to be retained for reserves and other expenditures

#### **Neighbourhood Plan**

The steering group is meeting monthly and we will bring a report next time. Among other things we are working on is a shopping list of infrastructure and facilities enhancements needed to go with site allocations of different sizes. No doubt the villages preferences will be for limited development. But the Local Plan may require more. Only larger sites will deliver any benefits. An NhP may provide more scope to obtain necessary upgrades than might be obtained from the very tight section 106 rules for individual developments. So having a list in our plan may guide what might be obtained, or indeed a developer may wish to offer as part of an application

negotiation.

The Hundred Parishes is blessed with an exceptional number of museums, all open at this time of the year.

Saffron Walden Museum was purpose-built in 1835. It displays a real treasure trove of

material relating to the local area.

Imperial War Museum, Duxford is enormous, displaying all kinds of wartime material including its own listed buildings from each World War, as well as many aeroplanes, both

civilian and military.

Great Dunmow Museum is housed in a former maltings. It encompasses displays about its former function as well as broader elements of Dunmow history.

Forge Museum in Much Hadham includes metal tools from the forge, while its own medieval wall paintings reveal an insight into Tudor fashion. Still in Much Hadham, the hamlet of Perry Green was for many years the home of sculptor

Henry Moore. Today, the Henry Moore Studio and gardens includes an extensive outdoor display of his large works and indoor history of his life.

Mountfitchet has an extensive tov museum Mountfitchet Castle which is itself a popular destination for children who probably don't realise that this fun place is teaching them a lot about the history of Norman times.

Ashdon Village Museum

Finchingfield's 15th-century Guildhall incorporates a small collection of local history, presented with help of modern technology.

Great Bardfield has a small Cottage Museum and also a village cage, a former lock up.

#### **Hub Status Opens Up New Opportunities for Hall**

The committee which runs Quendon & Rickling Village Hall hopes the venue's elevation to community hub status will attract a new group of users.

The village Hall Committee successfully applied to Gigaclear for free ultrafast full fibre broadband under the company's community hub scheme.

Gigaclear has extended its network to more 450 homes in the parish enabling homeowners to access fast and reliable broadband and its new Home Phone service.

The hall, which is self-funded, currently hosts a range of classes including dance exercise, Pilates, a U3A choir, clubs including wargamers and metal detectorists and regular users such as the Wednesday Club, Community Café and Quendon & Rickling Parish Council.

Hall Trustee Sonia Michaelides said the committee applied to join the community hub scheme both to enhance the experience of its regular visitors and also to attract new users.

She said: "Having access to ultrafast broadband will help make us stand out as an attractive proposition for potential new users. It also opens up new opportunities, with events such as film nights now a possibility. In the past, we've received enquiries from people looking to use the hall but when they discovered we didn't have broadband they went elsewhere. Hopefully that won't be the case anymore."

Sonia added: "The application process and installation were very straightforward and everyone we dealt with at Gigaclear was extremely helpful, professional and courteous. The Village Hall Committee wish to express how grateful they are to Gigaclear for providing the hub."

Gigaclear Community Engagement Manager Andrew Lipski said: "We're offering people living in rural areas such as Quendon and Rickling the same opportunity to

enjoy the many benefits that come with having access to full fibre broadband as people living in more populous, easyto-reach urban locations.

"This is important because these days, having access to digital services is no longer a nice-to-have for many people but an essential part of daily life. Whether we're working from home, keeping in touch with friends and family or utilising the latest Smart



technology, there's no substitute for fast and reliable full fibre broadband."

Other community hubs already established in Essex by Gigaclear include Ashdon Village Hall, Little Hallingbury Village Hall, Widdington Village Hall and Great Saling Millennium Hall.

#### **Quendon Estate & Maces Farms**

We are happy to announce that Harvest 2023 is officially underway. After recently

cutting our Winter Barley and having the straw baled, we now have a short window until the wheat, oats and beans are ready to be harvested.

Whilst the weather remains the main factor as to when the crops will be ready, please be aware that there will be an increased level of tractor and trailer movements in the local vicinity over the forthcoming weeks and throughout August. We estimate that we



will start cutting our wheat the week commencing 24th July. This is most likely to be

towards Frambury Lane alongside the M11 before moving north closer to Wicken Bonhunt. We then aim to finish harvest closer to Rickling Green where we will be cutting our beans and Spring Barley. This is however subject to change based on the weather and monitoring

the crops.

If you see us out and

about, please do give us a wave. We kindly ask that if you watch us during harvest that you remain a safe distance away on public rights of way or on the roadside. Please also keep dogs under close control at all times (on a lead preferably) should you see our machinery in the field or approaching along public rights of way.



We appreciate everyone's understanding and cooperation during harvest as we will be



working into the evening and starting in the early hours. We also appreciate the combine can generate dust when in operation. Where possible we always try to mitigate the impact by monitoring the wind direction.

Recently we have been in correspondence with the Parish Council regarding some footpaths where crops have started to lean/become overgrown after they had a strong growth spell in

Spring. After walking the respective footpaths, they remain passable but the crops need to be gently moved out of the way so they stand up vertically. We apologise for any inconvenience caused. As harvest progresses all of our fields will be cleared of

the standing crop in the very near future. Thereafter as part of our routine annual husbandry operations, in Autumn 23 and Spring 24 will we spray and mark out the footpaths across the Estate and Farm to ensure everyone can continue to enjoy the countryside.

If you do come across a physical obstruction e.g. a fallen tree on a public right of way, please let us know and we will coordinate the must appropriate course of action with Essex Highways. Contact details are RTimmins@pegasi.co.uk / 07468 012350.


