From the Vicarage Study

Rev. Neil McLeod,

Priest-in-Charge of Newport with Widdington, Quendon and Rickling.

Parish Council Meetings

July's meeting covered a variety of topics with much discussion on the Local Plan and the Neighbourhood Plan, this will be included in other articles throughout *The Link* but suffice to say it will certainly be in the interests of all of us to have a say in the future of our Village, keep an eye out for future correspondence.

Our Community Shop located in the Cricketers is now up and running, it is great for essentials and very handy with the benefit of exceptionally long opening hours.

The Parish Councillors are working hard on a number of issues, such as getting a good Broadband service to the area, looking at ways to make the B1383 safer for residents and keeping our footpaths clear of overhanging branches. You may have noticed a team from the Council clearing the pavement from Quendon Hall towards the Village, this is due to the efforts of one of the Parish Councillors. If the PC are aware of issues they will do their best to get them resolved.

In a previous *The Link* issue there was mention of the difficulties some residents were facing due to overhanging trees and hedges over pavements. Thank you to those that have worked on their gardens to make walking easier for residents, it has been much appreciated.

There is no meeting in August, the next will be September 13th, the PC will still be hard at work though, please contact the Parish Clerk with any issues.

This month's message from the Chairman of the Parish Council

First things first. Congratulations to all concerned, and thanks to the pub, for the opening of the shop. This is something that's been missing from the village for some time and it's great to see it up and running. As with so many things in life though, we need to use it if we're not to lose it. Hopefully, with regular and sufficient custom it will grow and be able to stock a growing choice of produce.

By far the most important issue to affect all of us is the new Local Plan, a draft of which has now been presented by UDC. I would urge everyone to visit the UDC website, where you can find a link to a consultation questionnaire. It only takes about ten minutes to complete. This is your chance to have your say on the Local Plan, which will allocate new development, infrastructure, services and employment to the villages and towns of Uttlesford for the next decade or so. It WILL have an effect on every household in the District. Please take the time to tell UDC what you think.

As we go into the summer break, (there is no PC meeting in August), I have a number of irons in the fire:

We are taking steps to secure the lease on the football pitch to ensure its continued use as such, and to protect it from the possibility of future development.

I am in discussion with ECC on the subject of road safety along the B1383 and along Green Road. In the case of the B1383 as it passes through the village, this includes the question of traffic speed and quantity management, hopefully with the introduction of at least one pedestrian crossing of some sort, and the repair and introduction where necessary, of pavements. This is likely to be a long process that will probably be ongoing beyond my presence on the PC, but I intend to move it forward as far as I possibly can before handing over the reins.

At our last meeting, the PC took the unusual step of providing a loan to the Village Hall Committee, so that work on repairs to the village hall can commence sooner rather than later. The loan will be repaid from funds due from CALA Homes as part of their planning permission, probably early in the new year. It will certainly be good to see this work done, which of course will benefit all those who use the hall.

Hopefully, by the time I write again in September I will be in a position to report favourably on these, and other issues we are dealing with. If you're going away on holiday I hope you have an enjoyable time, with trouble free travel, and return refreshed.

Warning on Rogue Traders

Police are warning members of the public to be vigilant after reports of rogue traders fleecing people out of thousands of pounds to fill in potholes.

According to numerous reports, the group claim they have tarmac left over from a previous job and can fill in the holes on private land for a fee.

Sgt Paul Downes said, "If you are approached by someone offering to fill in potholes I urge you not to agree to the work.

"The group lays a strip of tarmac and are charging, in some cases, several thousands of pounds.

"They are also threatening violence if you refuse to pay. The work is of poor quality and the prices are way above average for this work."

It follows incidents in the Dengie and Tendring areas and is thought the group are moving through the county offering the service.

This photograph shows the interior of Quendon Church before the replacement of the bell tower. Since then the stone angel lectern has been replaced with a wooden one. The stone angel was eventually removed from her position and on becoming damaged was taken to a masons yard at Littlebury, (presumably for repair) and then, so far as Mr Wright knew, on to the Bury St Edmunds area.

Also taken away was the "gypsy font" which had been found in a ditch behind the church and placed on the left-hand side of the entrance porch. It was here that babies born out of wedlock and gypsy children were christened.

Visitors to the church now may spot other differences.

THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY



In June, Society members visited Thaxted, one of the jewels amongst the Hundred Parishes. Local historian Bruce Munro showed us around the guildhall and the church, whilst Len Farren guided us through the windmill, which also houses a museum of local artefacts. It was a most enjoyable and informative morning. Even those who thought they knew Thaxted learned much more. Even without a personal guide, we encourage you to visit this small, historic Essex town. They welcome visitors with a free car park close to the centre and there are several places to eat.



Bruce encouraged us to view a short pre-war film that is now available online from the East Anglian Film Archive at <http://www.eafa.org.uk/catalogue/957>. I commend this as a wonderful look back at life in a rural community before most of us were born. The film shows the labour-intensive harvesting process, with a brief look at a harvest festival service conducted by Thaxted's famous vicar, Conrad Noel.

District Council News

Report from District Councillors Anthony Gerard and Neil Hargreaves

Local Plan Consultation

The proposed sites for development under the Uttlesford Local Plan have been published and the consultation is open until Monday 4th September.

Here is the link <https://www.uttlesford.gov.uk/draftplan2017> or search for 'uttlesford local plan 2017' to find it. The major change from previous attempts is the proposal is to build new settlements. These would be west of Braintree, at Little Easton near Dunmow, and north east of Great Chesterford. Although Quendon and Rickling are not earmarked for significant more development in the Plan, that does not stop developers making applications regardless. This is happening in Newport where Countryside Properties are seeking to build 150 houses way out of the village limits going down to the M11 on Wicken Road – a site not in the draft plan.

The consultation document is very large but contains some things which you could ignore. It 'starts' in 2011 so UDC have included maps and full detail of many sites already given permission, and often already built. Although this may be needed for the Inspector it seems a waste of paper and people's time asking for comment on these, when a one line summary might have done.

The only extra site in the consultation for Quendon and Rickling is the plot north of Bluebell Drive. **However we urge people to look at and comment on the policies.** Planning applications must adhere to them, or have other significant benefits, if a policy is to be ignored. Specific policies are what need to be quoted for example if an application is being objected to, or developer contributions wanted for infrastructure. Planning applications are a legal and procedural process, and saying 'we've had enough already' doesn't work.

Unhelpfully the policies are dotted about the vast document. Appendix 1 starting on p302 lists the ones they have altered from existing policies (also unhelpfully their reference numbers have been reused eg ref H3 Infilling with New Houses has been reused as H3 Subdivision of dwellings....'). But there is no complete list. Much of what is in them is statements of the obvious eg 'developments should accord with appropriate space standards'. Not that the standards are listed or reference to them given.

The good news is the policies are mostly brief and highlighted in grey boxes. My recommendation would be download the documents as a pdf, which makes it easier to navigate and search. Just look at the grey policy boxes. The text around them is explanatory and in my view padded, and in any case it is the policy which is enforceable, not the waffle.

Two examples

Policy INF2 – Open Spaces, Sports Facilities and Pitches. In 2012 UDC calculated all the sports provision the district would need, what it would cost, how many houses were to be built and exactly what cash payment every house built would need to pay. The document is still valid and we tried to use it to get Cala to help with the Village Hall. But INF2 fails to enforce this, or really much at all. It is accompanied by two pages of management speak. For example 'health and well being is inextricably linked to socio-economic and environmental factors' or providing 'consciously-designed open space'. As distinct from what?! I think this is an area where we should be asking for specific enforceable policies, not 'seekings' and 'encouragings' which developers are free to ignore.

Policy D2: Car Parking Design. This is one paragraph of subjective niceties, which are fine. But in practice any layout, however odd, which meets the spaces per bedroom requirement gets passed. Where is the consideration of triple tandem car parking, as permitted in Granta Mead Close (Newport – by the Coach Horses)?

So please do make the effort to comment on the policies!

Going away on holiday

Make your home look like someone is living in it:

- Avoid discussing holiday plans on public social networking sites - burglars can use any information you post on there to their advantage - I would add to this watch what you are posting while you are away too or you may find you are giving useful information that the burglar or fraudster may use.
