## From the Vicarage Study Priest-in-Charge of Newport with Widdington, Quendon and Rickling.

#### Rev Pete's thoughts for the summer.

If you're a sports fan, this summer has had plenty to offer: tennis at Wimbledon, football with the women's world cup, Formula 1, various Diamond League athletics events, The Open Golf Championship, and The Ashes series, The Hundred 2023, rugby warm ups for the World Cup, an Anthony Joshua knock out, and the recent start of the Premier League's new season to name a few. Sport remains one area of life that generates excitement and celebration, when for just a moment we can find ourselves experiencing a collective euphoria which overtakes us as we jump, smile, hug, punch the air, without any sense of embarrassment at what we are doing. Equally, sport can cause us great disappointment, leave us feeling low, greatly disappointed, and awaiting with resigned trepidation being on the end of the banter and mocking of family or work colleagues.



Sport, for many, has the capacity to engage with them and affect them in ways most of the rest of life doesn't seem to match. For others for whom sport doesn't touch them in this way, music may be their way of being similarly engaged and affected, or great art

or architecture, literature, the natural beauty of the world, the mysteries of the universe, the birth of a child, and so on.

The common denominator in all such things is their capacity to engage us at a level that doesn't bypass our ability to think and reason about, but does however touch our inner being at what some might understand as the level of the soul. Experiences that touch us at this level can be transformative in a way no matter of thinking and reasoning can. Things that connect and impact us at this level of our being can leave an indelible impact upon us, and alter our view and understanding of life and direction in a heartheat.

I believe such moments that transform us for good, whether discovered through sport, art, literature, natural beauty, new life, and more can be windows into the heart of God and the reality and presence of God within his creation and beyond. For, in my understanding of God, the divide between what might get called secular or sacred is an unnecessary binary template through which to view life.

It is no coincidence that Jesus used the everyday language and experiences of his hearers when he was trying to communicate truths about the character and place of God in their world and lives. He spoke about fishing, cleaning the home, being woken by a friend in need, sheep, goats, parties, wedding celebrations, taxes, strained family relationships, wine, and so on and so on.

I would love to see more people coming along and joining the church family of the churches I oversee, Quendon, Rickling, Widdington, and Newport. But equally, I realise that for many, their place of initial engagement with God is not found in church, but is brought about by the soul touching experiences mentioned above.



And yet, there is much to be said in gathering with others, who themselves believe their souls to have been touched by the mystery, wonder, and glory of God, and for whom Christ is the clearest image and conveyor of God. For together we can find further food for our souls in the teachings of Christ, deepen and sharpen our

ability to recognise God in all things, at times even experience those same kind of moments of exhilaration, celebration, and joy spoken of above. You never know until you give it a try.

#### **Rural England Prosperity Fund**

The Rural England Prosperity Fund (REPF) is an addendum to the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and aims to support activities that specifically address the challenges rural areas face.

UDC has been allocated £813,487 and the overall aim of the REPF Programme is to support those that live and work within the rural economy to take advantage of the opportunities that the area provides. The programme will be delivered through the funding of capital projects for small businesses and existing cultural, historic and heritage institutions. Projects must meet the key investment priorities and the defined strategic objectives.

Capital grants of between £5,000 - £150,000 will be available to support new and existing rural businesses to develop new products and facilities that will be of wider benefit to the local economy. This includes farm businesses looking to diversify income streams. These grants must be spent by March 2025. And there is a one-year fund needing to be spent by March 2024 of capital grants of between £1,000 - £15,000 to existing cultural, historic and heritage institutions that make up the local cultural heritage offer. Deadlines for submission for REPF grants are 8 September 2023, 10 November 2024 and 5 January 2024 and the assessment panel will meet within about two weeks of each deadline.

#### **Local Design Code consultation**

The Design Code will set out a series of rules and guidelines that, when followed, should ensure that development proposals are to the highest quality expected by Uttlesford District Council. These must be considered in any planning application. The document is a massive 244 pages although the policies section of it is a mere 140 or so pages. But please, if you have interest in how housing and development should



be done, do take part in the consultation. The short online consultation doesn't go into useful detail and allows only Yes or No answers, where the response needs to be more nuanced. So I'm going to respond by email on individual policies.

You may want to muse on whether the structure of Quendon & Rickling is, or perhaps are, linear, polyfocal linear, nucleated or focal linear. See page 86 of said document.

Residents living in the countryside of the Hundred Parishes are fortunate that the intrusive sounds of human activities are less, when compared to those living within built up areas close to main roads or railway tracks or beneath regular flight paths. Even within our homes our ears are subjected to a cacophony of sounds: TV or radio programmes, ring tones, the hum of machines, barking dogs or noisy neighbours.

Rarely are we surrounded by silence!

Appreciating tranquillity is an essential aspect of being in the countryside, where it should be possible to scan attractive views of verdant landscapes or cloudy skyscapes, hear natural sounds and catch glimpses of wildlife without intrusive background noises. Evidence gathered over the past 15 years reveals that tranquillity is not just a pleasurable experience, but is essential for human health and wellbeing reducing stress levels and lifting spirits.



In the early 1990's concerns were raised about the harmful levels of intrusive noise in daily lives. The Countryside Commission and the Council for the Protection of Rural England worked together to produce an Intrusion Map, which highlighted areas that were most affected by human-induced noises. Since then, research has been undertaken by CPRE and others to develop suitable methodology for measuring noise and evaluate the visual impact of developments on landscapes.

In 2012, tranquillity gained recognition in national planning policy. Now studies are prepared to evaluate Landscape Character Areas and their Sensitivity to Change, and these are included in the reports prepared for Local Plans. They must include appropriate mitigation measures to help reduce intrusive noise to acceptable levels.

The walk descriptions listed on the Hundred Parishes website provide opportunities to appreciate the tranquillity of this part of the country, to hear bird song, sense the wind in the trees and view some wonderful rural landscapes.

#### **Quendon Estate & Maces Farms**

As we continue to make progress with harvest, the weather has certainly been the continued topic of conversation each day. The wet weather during July and early August has made conditions very difficult. We are however targeting every window of dry and sunny weather to bring our crops in.





We appreciate everyone's continued understanding and cooperation during harvest, as we will be working into the evening and starting in the early hours. We also appreciate the combine can generate dust when in operation. Where possible we always try to mitigate the impact by monitoring the wind direction.

At that date of writing, we are just over halfway through harvest and the combine will shortly be making its way back towards Rickling Green to start cutting our beans.

If you see us out and about, please do give us a wave. We kindly ask that if you watch us during harvest that you remain a safe distance away on public rights of way or on the roadside. Please also keep dogs under close control at all times (on a lead preferably) should you see our machinery in the field or approaching along public rights of way.

At the same time as harvest, we have drilled our 2023/24 Oil Seed Rape which was then rolled to secure moisture and provide it with the best opportunity of enhancement.

#### First Aid in Quendon and Rickling

Ten villagers attended a one-day First Aid course, provided by the Parish Council, in the Village Hall in August, age range from teenagers to the fairly recently retired, new arrivals in the village to residents long-in-the-tooth.

We learnt both in theory and practice from the British Red Cross about CPR, use of the Defibrillator and how to handle medical emergencies from common causes, as well as sharing some deep wells of experience both as victim and carer! We all came away with much more confidence and knowledge of what to do in such emergencies.

Some of the newly trained first aiders will join the Defibrillator (AED) team able and willing to provide assistance with emergencies where an AED is needed. 

#### Saffron Walden Rocks


The new panel for the geology in the Museum grounds


