From the Vicarage Study

Rev. Neil McLeod,

Priest-in-Charge of Newport with Widdington, Quendon and Rickling.

Café Explore

What I hear you cry is Café Explore? Well, Café Explore is a new initiative that I am currently thinking about. Why? Well it is quite clear that for many people Sunday morning church services just do not matter to them anymore. Some may think church is irrelevant. Some may have too much other stuff going on at weekends to even think about squeezing church in. Some may think it is old fashioned. For whatever reason many people only come to church for funerals, weddings, baptism and festival services such as Christmas, Easter and Harvest. I hope that Café Explore appeals to all people.

There are several key points about Café Explore that I'd like to share with you:

1. **It is not going to run on a Sunday morning.** I'm fully booked on Sunday mornings, and as I have already stated many other people are busy then too. It is likely to be a late afternoon on either a Saturday or a Sunday.
2. **It is not going to run in the church building.** I believe that we can be church anywhere; we do not have to worship inside one of the church buildings in Quendon or Rickling. I love those buildings and think that they are beautiful, but they do not work for Café Explore. Also, for many people the church building can be off-putting. So I am going to look at running Café Explore in the village hall.
3. **It is not a replica of a Sunday morning service.** Church services can be difficult for people to engage with because of the language we use, and many people do not give themselves time to learn and appreciate it. Café Explore will not have church liturgy. It will have talks, discussions and maybe a short time of prayer. I want it to be easily accessible to people who come to it.
4. **It is about God in the world around us.** I believe that God is in everything that we do, but more than that I believe that we can see God in everything around us. Not just a beautiful landscape; not just a solitary rose but everywhere. Yet sometimes we miss him. Café Explore is about seeing God in the present day, and in everything around us.
5. **It is about seeing the spiritual in the secular.** Do you have a favourite film, book or poem? Do you have a favourite TV programme? Is there a painting or photograph that you've seen that just astonishes you? I'd like us to explore these things together, and to find God in them. My aim in Café Explore is to look at the things that we love and are familiar with, to view them with a different perspective and to share God. But not in a heavy way.

Has this piqued your curiosity? I hope so. Hopefully over August I shall make some time to sit down and plan several sessions for Café Explore, which I can let you know about in due course. I'll also plan the practicalities of when and where we can meet together. If you want to know more or if you have some ideas of what to look at, please do get in touch with me. Thank you.

Demand Responsive Transport (DaRT) Service

This is an alternative way of providing access to key services in rural areas. Instead of using fixed routes with fixed stops and times, DaRT customers book journeys with the operator in advance and are picked up from an agreed point – often their own home, a bus stop or local place of interest.

This month's message from the Chairman of the Parish Council

The burning topic recently is of course the CALA Homes application at Ventnor Lodge. The latest development, no pun intended, is that the District Council has slowed things down by telling CALA that they weren't sure about the PC position on affordable housing. This was somewhat annoying to me since I had discussed the matter with them a couple of months ago. It now seems that this was a tactic by the planning department to delay the process, simply because they are overstretched. The result is that the application won't go to the committee until August. Hopefully I will be in a position to relay their decision in the next issue of THE LINK.

We continue to receive complaints from people who walk in the woods or along the footpaths around the villages, about the failure of dog walkers to clear up after their dogs, and the practice of some, of tying bags containing dogs mess to the lower branches of trees. Both of which are pretty disgusting. I would again appeal to dog walkers to make use of the dog waste bins around the villages or, if there isn't one close by, to take your bags home with you. It is in no way acceptable for others, especially with children, to have to avoid, or clean off their shoes, the mess left by irresponsible people.

We are still trying to find a solution to parking both on the B1383 and in Green Road. It may be that you will have seen or heard of various suggestions as to how we can proceed. Apparently our ideas are causing some concern among some residents. Please be assured that we are simply looking for a solution to the problem and as yet, we are far from putting anything in place. But please also bear in mind, especially if you regularly park on the footway, that pedestrians have a right of way on a footpath and you should park with consideration, and not block the pavement, forcing pedestrians, some with pushchairs or with young children on cycles, into the road.

Finally, you will probably have seen representatives from Gigaclear around the village. They have probably knocked on your door, and you may have attended their presentation in the village hall. It seems that the information presented to us on that evening was not particularly clear, so four members of the PC met with two of their team to clarify the details of their work. I would stress that the PC will not endorse a business or assist them in any way to make sales, but I will now briefly tell you what they had to say. If you wish to investigate further Mark Vile, one of their sales team can be contacted on 07976 396158.

Gigaclear are a private company trying to set up, essentially in competition with Openreach to provide a high speed internet service. If enough people in a given area sign up, they will lay fibre optics through the area and, when customers decide to go ahead, will connect those cables to your house. The main difference here is that Openreach end fibre connection at the junction box, then continue with the present copper cables to your home. Gigaclear then contract to supply your internet service for 12 months but you remain free to access whichever service provider you choose, through Gigaclear's infrastructure. Their cables are not affected by whether since they are all below ground, or water, since they do not use electricity. Information is transmitted by light. They also stressed that the prices you may have seen in their literature are inclusive of VAT and they do not make a charge for line rental. I would again stress that this is not a sales pitch. If you want to know any more, give them a call.

That's it from me, enjoy the summer. It's actually very warm and sunny as I write!

Run by Dementia Friends Champion Debbie Baker and two volunteers, the group was launched in October last year after Debbie spotted the need for more activity groups, while working for a Dementia Charity.



The group uses cognitive stimulation to help maintain independence, improve memory and socialising among the members.

During the session the members enjoy a fun filled day with a variety of activities and workshops including physical exercise, such as dance, exercise to music, indoor golf, volley ball, musical workshops, plus cognitive activities such as discussions on current affairs, arts and crafts, crosswords, quizzes, board games and entertainment.

Pam, whose husband attended the group for the first time, wrote: "Just to let you know my husband enjoyed this morning, in fact he said he wouldn't mind going every day". She went on to say that it was great to have some time to herself for a few hours, and she felt that services like this have prevented them both from sinking into deep depression.

The group is open from 10am - 3pm with members either attending all day or just for the morning or afternoon session. A hot meal at lunch time is provided by Herts Independent Living Services and refreshments are available throughout the day.

The Hundred Parishes Society

Successive generations of humans have modified the appearance of the landscape through the creation of fields, enclosed parks, roads and settlements of varying sizes while leaving areas of woodland here and there. In his recent talk to Society members, Tony Morton told us about woodlands in and around the Hundred Parishes, many of which are Essex Wildlife Trust nature reserves. He explained the special features of such flower-rich ancient woodlands and discussed the traditional management techniques required to maintain them.

During the 18th century those with extensive estates developed a passion for large scale landscape improvement and 2016 marks the tercentenary of the birth of Lancelot "Capability" Brown. He is remembered for his involvement in over 170 parks across the country, many of which still survive. An astute project manager, he was nicknamed "Capability" because he would convince his clients that their estate had capability for improvement. He had an effective team of contractors who were able to implement his recommendations, many requiring reconfiguration of lakes and substantial plantings of trees. Brown's skill was to reshape these parks and gardens from formal geometric plots into more natural pastoral scenes, creating the vision of the English countryside we know today. His local commissions included the wonderful grounds at Audley End House.

Brown was also involved at Hatfield Forest, which is well worth a visit at any time of the year. This August, to help commemorate Brown's actual birthday, there is the added attraction of 18th-century themed teas!

We are fortunate that the local area also includes some wonderful private gardens which are holding open days in the coming month. Details of these and other opportunities for days out can be found on the What's On page of our website: www.hundredparishes.org.uk.

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme

Would you like to see a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in the Villages?

We did have a scheme, but when Gavin Lord, our Coordinator, moved away from the area, nobody came forward to take his place.

Residents' comments in The Village Plan suggest that many of you would like to have a local scheme again, so what will it take?

To get this scheme back on its feet, we need volunteers from every part of the parish to work together to establish a network of local points of contact. Information can then be exchanged between all relevant local authorities, the District and Local Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators and your neighbours. This will be Quendon & Rickling's Neighbourhood Watch Scheme and we can make it work for all of us.

Are you interested in working with your neighbours to promote crime prevention, safety and neighbourliness in your community?

We will only ask you to do what you can in the time available to you. You will need to have Internet access, as this will be the main means of communication. Once the scheme is established, there will be occasional meetings with other members of the neighbourhood team to exchange ideas, information and to plan for the future.

Report from District Councillors Neil Hargreaves and Joanna Parry

The target date for determination of the Cala Homes Ventnor Lodge application for 12 houses was 12 July, but we still await the officer's recommendation, after which it will go to the Planning Committee. Two updates relating to this:

Essex Education has posted that 'this size is below Essex County Council new threshold for education contributions, and thereby, I can confirm ECC will not be requesting s106 education contributions'. As collecting these funds requires no effort on the part of Essex (the s106 agreement is done by UDC, who also collect the funds and forward them to Chelmsford) I can see no reason why they should not collect from all sizes of development. To give you an idea of what is being missed, the 21 house development next to the Coach & Horses in Newport paid £126k towards early years, primary and secondary, and a further £12k for other things in the village. So on this basis Cala would be contributing around £79,000, but unless the UDC officer and the Planning Committee enforce a contribution for local facilities, as requested by the parish council, it will be nothing. Essex didn't comment as to whether they have school places available.

The other matter is that brown long-eared bats and 24 common pipistrelle live at the site. (Yes they have been counted!) This means that a licence from Natural England would be required before their habitat can be destroyed. The brown long eared, pictured, is the second most common in the UK after the pipistrelle. I assume alternative accommodation will be required to be provided - examples are on the Bat Conservation Trust website.



If you wish to comment further on this application it has remained open online even though it should have closed in June. Follow the links on the UDC website then search 'Ventnor', or email them.

A while ago there were postings on the Quendon & Rickling Facebook about irresponsible owners not picking up dog poo. You may be interested in the success of a campaign by Newport PC using fluorescent spray to highlight the poo on pavements and footpaths. The PC bought the sprays and volunteers spray the offending messes with lurid (biodegradable) paint, see photo. This has been very effective at reducing the problem such that one of the volunteers on the walking bus to the primary school says she now doesn't usually take it with her. We monitor results by switching colours every month – if there is less of the new colour we are succeeding.



The way it seems to work is that dogs and owners are creatures of habit. They walk the same routes at the same times and the dogs typically go about 10 minutes after leaving the house, and so they poo at the same places. When the owners see spray highlighting what they should have picked up the day before it tells them they have been spotted and they start to behave more responsibly. The

psychology is to target those who know what they should do, but avoid picking up when they think they can't be seen. This is why it is worse in winter.

The footpaths going out of the village were particularly bad and it seems owners who would pick up without hesitation along the street maybe thought that tarmac is where their responsibility ends. It doesn't – we have to clean up anywhere where people might walk. As for those who bag it up and then abandon the bags hanging on bushes, there is no excuse for such unpleasant behaviour, so the bags get sprayed as well. Some residents have also obtained plastic signs from the dog warden to press home the message



On the Newport facebook one owner said he preferred it 'left natural', which didn't exactly find favour with other group members. Although we still have some offenders, generally it has been very effective, and some paths which were fouled all the time are now clean.

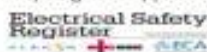
