# From the Vicarage Study Rev. Neil McLeod, Priest-in-Charge of Newport with Widdington, Quendon and Rickling.

'The Way we Were', 'Yesterday', 'Summer of '69' and 'It was a Very Good Year' are all songs about looking back, with regard to a personal relationship or a moment in time. It seems appropriate to think about those songs at the moment because, as a church and as a nation, we are approaching the key point in our calendar for remembering.

### Sunday 30th October:

This is the day for the annual Commemoration Service. The service is for anyone who still grieves for a loved one, irrespectively of how long it has been since their passing. The church does send invitations to families for whom we have conducted funerals for in the past two years, but the service is open to anyone & everyone. My mum & dad passed away, respectively, in 2002 & 2006 but I still like to use this service as a focused act of remembrance. There is an opportunity to write something about your loved one(s) and you may even wish to light a candle for them. It is a quieter reflective service, and there is a focused sense of peace when the candles are lit and the lights turned out. It would be lovely to welcome you into the service. The service will be at 6.00pm in Newport Church.

### Sunday 13th November:

If the Commemoration Service is about personal remembering, then this day is our corporate act of remembering alongside the rest of the nation, and across the globe. The Remembrance Day Service this year will focus upon the anniversary of the ending of the Battle of the Somme. I marked the beginning of this battle earlier in the summer, and in the Remembrance Sunday service will use material (poems & letters) from the Royal British Legion. The main service is in Newport Church at which we gather at 10.50 for our act of remembrance at the war memorial. We then make our way into church for the service.

In the evening there is a communion service in Quendon Church at 6.00pm, during which the names of people on the rolls of remembrance are read out. I hope that you'll join me at one of the services to remember those who fought in conflict for us.

# This month's message from the Chairman of the Parish Council

I wrote last time that we are in need of a new Clerk and a Parish Councillor, to replace our outgoing members. Happily we have had two applications for the post of Clerk and I hope to be able to confirm the new appointment very soon. But we still need another Councillor. Apart from our regular meetings, roughly once per month, the work really isn't particularly onerous. In fact, if you're doing it because you're interested and care about the place where you live, it isn't work at all. So if you feel you might like to join us, or if you want to start by just discussing what we do behind the scenes before you make a decision, please call me.....542527.

You will see elsewhere some information about broadband but I'd like just to emphasise one or two points. Openreach, through Superfast Essex may be making some upgrades to cabinets in the village but as it stands it would appear that these will have limited benefit to very few properties. If you are content with the service you have that's fine. But it looks increasingly likely that, due to the interest from Gigaclear, the village will not be upgraded by Openreach, to superfast broadband. Simultaneously, it seems that Gigaclear still haven't attracted enough interest to justify investment either. So it may well be that we will fall through the 'upgrade net' completely. This will be bad news for those who struggle with the current service. I will be raising questions with ECC in an attempt to have us reinstated on the Superfast programme but, while I hesitate to do others sales work for them, it seems our best hope of securing high speed broadband is to sign up to Gigaclear. The choice is yours.

We have made some progress on the issue of parking in Green Road, especially near the school. Providing we can secure permission to site two speed limit sign- posts on the edges of the green, the speed limit from the junction of the 1383, to the triangle by the village sign, will be reduced to 20mph, and we are hopeful that school zig zag lines will be painted at the entrance to the school/pub road. Thanks to Paul who is doing the work on this.

That's it for this month; I for one, can't wait for the next gripping instalment.

# THE HUNDRED PARISHES SOCIETY

The Society held its annual general meeting in September at the Forge Museum, Much Hadham. The formal business was preceded by a most interesting guided stroll around Much Hadham, led by museum curator Cristina Harrison. There is much to see all along the High Street and inside the church. Much Hadham became an important place almost a thousand years ago when the first palace

was built here for the Bishop of London. It was used by the bishops for hundreds of years and Edmund Tudor was born there in 1430. His son became King Henry VII in 1485, the first of the Tudor dynasty. The current palace, dating from the 16th century, still stands beside the church. It is no longer used by the bishops and has been converted into private houses.

After the short formal meeting, members of the Hundred Parishes Society explored the excellent small museum, built around the forge which is still used. There was an added bonus as Cristina explained the museum's fascinating Elizabethan wall paintings. They have been there for some 400 years and were hidden beneath several layers of paint until their recent restoration.

There is a surprising number of museums within the Hundred Parishes, covering a whole range of interests and all staffed by enthusiastic people. Most have now closed for the winter, but a few remain open. These are: Imperial War Museum, Duxford, and Saffron Walden Museum are open most days, whilst Linton Zoo, Great Dunmow Maltings Museum and Ashdon Museum have limited hours.
